



Domiciliary care managers on the Register – 1 April 2018

Factsheet

What are the key points?

Domiciliary care managers have been registered with us since 2013

642 managers are registered, an increase from **633** last year



622 are currently working in adult care

The register is now open to domiciliary care workers, who must be registered by April 2020

What are the trends?

The number of domiciliary care managers on the Register has grown steadily year-on-year

The ratio of women to men has remained mostly unchanged at **4:1**

The percentage of managers working for local authority social services has fallen from 20% in 2014 to 13% this year

The percentage of managers working in the third sector has increased from 19% in 2014 to 25% this year

How many managers left and joined the Register?

80 managers left the Register and **89** joined



Why did managers leave?

69% did not maintain their registration

6% changed to an adult care home manager

5% retired

What qualifications do managers hold?

All domiciliary care managers hold a releveant qualification

32.7% now hold the current QCF Level 5 Diploma in Leadership for Health and Social Care Services (Adults' Management)

All others hold an accepted alternative qualification



Where are managers employed?

61% work in the private sector

13% work in the local authority social services

25% work in the third sector

28% of managers have been in their current role for more than 10 years

39% of managers have changed to a new role within the last three years



What is the profile of the managers?

There are **517 women** and **125 men**



Their average age is 49

97.3% of managers are white, white British, white Welsh or white Irish

36.2% of managers spoke some **Welsh** or were fluent
