



Residential child care managers on the Register

1 April 2019



What are the main points?

Residential child care managers have had to register with us since **2007**

231 managers are registered, an increase from **205** in **2018**

217 are currently working in residential child care

185 residential child care services are registered with Care Inspectorate Wales

Some managers on the Register work as deputy or assistant manager



What are the trends?

The number of residential child care managers on the Register has increased by **29%** in the last five years

The ratio of women to men remains unchanged at **2:1**

The percentage of managers employed in the private sector has increased from **76% in 2014** to **78% this year**

The percentage who had been in their current role for five years or more has increased from 25% in 2014 to 33% this year



How many left and joined the Register?

In the last year, 14 managers left the Register and 40 joined

64% of those leaving were removed as they did not maintain their registration

36% of those leaving requested removal as they no longer worked in residential child care in Wales



What qualifications do managers hold?

All residential child care managers hold a relevant qualification

54% now hold the current QCF Level 5 Diploma in Leadership for Health and Social Care Services Children and Young People's Residential Management (Wales)

All others hold an accepted equivalent qualification



Where are managers employed?

74% work in the private sector

17% work in local authority social services

33% of managers have been in their current role for five years or more

52% of managers have changed to a new role in the last three years



What is the profile of the managers?

There are **144** women and **87** men

The average age of managers is **44**

96% of managers are white, white British, white Welsh or white Irish

34% speak some Welsh or are fluent

1% of managers have a disability
