This accessibility statement explains how this website meets the regulations for accessibility on public sector websites.

Social Care Wales is committed to making our websites and mobile applications accessible, in accordance with the <u>Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile</u> Applications) (No. 2) Accessibility Regulations 2018.

This accessibility statement applies to <u>socialcare.wales</u>.

Compliance status

This website is partially compliant with the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines version 2.2 AA standard, due to the non-compliances listed below.

Non-accessible content

The content listed below is non-accessible for the following reasons:

Content that's not within the scope of the accessibility regulations

Many of our older PDFs and Word documents do not meet WCAG 2.1 success criterion 4.1.2. This is because they:

- do not have suitable tags for screens readers
- do not have bookmarks to help screen readers navigate

- are missing a language definition to allow a screen reader to select the correct language when reading aloud
- do not have a title to allow screen readers to identify the document topic.

The accessibility regulations <u>do not require us to fix PDFs or other documents</u> <u>published before 23 September 2018</u>, if they're not essential to providing our services. For example, we do not plan to fix <u>Evidence Matters in Family Justice –</u> Handbook.

Any new PDFs or Word documents we publish will meet accessibility standards.

What we're doing to improve accessibility

We're now creating fewer PDF and Word documents, and uploading content as HTML pages as much as possible. We will review the fonts and colours used throughout the website to make sure all content is accessible.

We're regularly using tools such as <u>SiteImprove</u> and <u>axe DevTools</u> to review and fix any accessibility issues.

Preparation of this accessibility statement

This statement was first prepared on 19 September 2019. It was last reviewed on 25 September 2024.

The statement has been updated annually. In October 2023, a report by the Government Digital Service was presented to Social Care Wales. The report outlined accessibility issues with the website, which were resolved in November 2023. This statement was updated accordingly.

The statement was prepared using the accessibility tools in SiteImprove and the Government Digital Service report. SiteImprove is regularly used to monitor the site's accessibility and to identify issues.

Enforcement procedure

The Equality and Human Rights Commission (EHRC) is responsible for enforcing the Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) (No. 2) Accessibility Regulations 2018 (the 'accessibility regulations').
