Our 2024 survey of the social care workforce is now closed.

Thank you to the more than 5,000 people who took part.

Just like in 2023, we asked social care workers to answer questions about things like health and well-being, pay and conditions, and what they like about working in the sector.

We carried out this survey again so we can start to monitor trends in what people think about working in social care.

We'll publish the results on our website later this year and we'll use the findings to shape the support we and our partners offer, and to highlight important issues to policymakers in Welsh Government.

All of your answers will be kept anonymous and we'll share the findings on our website after the results have been analysed.

What were the results of the 2023 survey?

We announced [the results of our 2023 pilot survey](#) in October, which showed that social care workers feel valued by the people and families they support,

but also undervalued by the public and underpaid for the work they do.
