Social workers on the Register

What are the main points?

Social workers have had to register with us since 2005

6,263 social workers are registered, an increase from 6,133 in 2018

> 3,806 have a social work caseload

The Register of social workers is well established and numbers have remained steady

What are the five-year trends?

The ratio of women to men remains 4:1

The percentage of social workers employed by local authority social services decreased from 75% in 2014 to 72% this year

The percentage employed in the private sector increased from 5% in 2014 to 8%

The percentage who hold a master's or bachelor's degree in social work increased from 29% in 2014 to 46% this year



How many left and joined the **Register?**

In the last year, 276 social workers left the Register and 406 joined

48% of those leaving did not maintain their registration

25% of those leaving retired

8% continued to work in social care outside Wales

3 social workers were removed following a fitness to practise hearing



What gualifications do social workers hold?

46% hold a bachelor's or master's degree in social work

> 38% hold a diploma in social work

13% hold an older accepted social work qualification

3% qualified outside the UK



Where are social workers employed?

72% work in local authority social services

8% work in the private sector

5% work in the third sector

4% are self-employed

43% of social workers have been in their current role for three years or less

12% have been in their current role for 10 years or more



What is the profile of social workers?

> There are 5,114 women and 1,149 men

The average age of social workers is 46

88% of social workers are white, white British, white Welsh or white Irish

38.5% of social workers speak some Welsh or are fluent

> 2.5% of social workers have a disability
